### Part 2 - Hearing for Yourself

## A BIG QUESTION WE MUST ANSWER

- Who do we say Jesus is (Matthew 16:15-17 NKJV)
  - 1. Peter had the right answer The Christ, the Son of the Living God
  - 2. This answer needs to be personal
- A great progression example (John 4:39-42 NKJV)
  - 1. The woman at the well told them about Jesus
  - 2. But they did not stop there
  - 3. This is where we want to go (2 Corinthians 4:13 NKJV)

## A GREAT WAY TO HEAR FOR YOURSELF - SOAP JOURNALING

- S: Scripture
  - 1. Take a scripture that captured your attention during your reading
  - 2. Write it down unless you are capturing a longer passage
- O: Observation
  - 1. What does that scripture say to you
  - 2. This is purely what you see in this scripture
  - 3. Write that information down does not have to be long or grammatically accurate
- · A: Application
  - 1. How can you apply this scripture to your life
  - 2. Sometimes you may have to admit you are needing extra help making the application
  - 3. Again, this is not a win/lose, good/bad proposition it's personal
- P: Praver
  - 1. Write down a short prayer related to this scripture
  - 2. Could be a plea for help in this area or forgiveness for not complying
  - 3. Could be a prayer of thanksgiving for what God has done for you
- The value of SOAP journaling (Mark 4:24-25 NASB)
  - 1. Help you discern what the Lord is saying to you
  - 2. Help you clarify your thought processes
  - 3. Help you remember what the Lord has highlighted
  - 4. Help you see a pattern of what God was saying
  - 5. Becomes a valuable book as the years go by to see God's hand in your life

# WHEN IT BECOMES PERSONAL, IT BECOMES POWERFUL IN YOUR LIFE (John 4:46-50 NKJV)

- The nobleman had a problem
  - 1. He came to Jesus and asked
  - 2. Jesus corrected him unless you see / feel, you won't believe
  - 3. The man kept asking
  - 4. Jesus spoke to him that his son would live
